

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# Part 1 – Introduction

### **Product Features**

**DC-D6831WRA/DC-D6631WRA** are IP-based network cameras that compress and transmit video over Ethernet.

You can use the IDIS Discovery program to change network camera settings or the IDIS Center program to manage multiple network cameras. In addition, the embedded web server (IDIS Web) lets you remotely view live video or scan recorded video using a web browser. In addition, you can use the IDIS Center to manage network cameras and view/record video.



In this operation manual, the term **Remote System** refers to the computer on which the remote program (IDIS Center or IDIS Web) is running.

#### · IR LED

A sensor in the middle monitors lighting levels and activates the IR LED during low-lighting conditions.

#### Lens

A motorized focus and zoom lens is installed.

#### · Factory Reset Button

Restores the camera's default factory settings. For more information, refer to the **Factory Reset**.

#### · Lever

Separate the camera body and mounting bracket.

#### · Anti-Reflection Bushing

Prevents reflection caused by the IR LED to ensure accurate detection.

#### · Installation Bracket

Install the network camera to the wall or ceiling.

#### · Power (DC12V)

Connect this to the power adapter. A A-type jack is used for the power adapter. (External diameter x internal diameter: 5.5 x 2.5)

#### Network Port

Connect a network cable with an RJ-45 connector to this port. If using a PoE switch, you can supply power to the camera using an Ethernet cable. For more information on PoE switch use, refer to the switch manufacturer's operation manual. You can configure, manage, and upgrade this camera and monitor its images from a remote computer over the network. For more information on network connection setup, refer to the **IDIS Discovery operation manual**.

#### · Wall/Ceiling Installation Hole

Used to screw the camera in place on a wall or a ceiling.

#### Audio


- O (Out): Connect an amplifier to this port (line out). This device does not feature a built-in audio amplifier unit and therefore requires the user to purchase a separate speaker system with a built-in amplifier.
- I (In): Connect an audio source to this port. (Line in)

#### Alarm

O (Out): It is the BJT (Bipolar Junction Transistor)
 open collector output. If the voltage and current exceed the specification limit (Max. Load: 30mA, Max. Voltage: 5VDC), the product could be damaged. When connecting the device which exceeds the specification limit, refer to the picture (circuit) below.



If used with an external inductive load(e.g. relay), a diode must be connected in parallel with the load for protection. Otherwise, the product could be damaged.



- I (In): Connect an alarm-in device to this port. (Mechanism: Choose between an NC (Normally Closed) type or an NO (Normally Open) type) → Connect a mechanical or electrical switch to the alarm in port and the GND (ground) connector. Alarm in range is 0V to 5V. In order to detect alarm input from an electrical switch, the signal must be higher than 4.3V from an NC switch or less than 0.3V from an NO switch and must last for longer than 0.5 seconds.

#### · SD Memory Card Slot

Used to insert a micro SD memory card into the camera. (An SLC (Single Level Cell) or MLC (Multi Level Cell) card by San Disk or Transcend is recommended)



- Do not remove the SD memory card while the system is in operation. Removing the card while the system is in operation can cause the system to malfunction and/or corrupt data stored on the SD memory card.
- An SD memory card is a consumable product with a finite service life. Prolonged use will damage the card's memory sectors and result in data loss or memory card failure. Test the SD memory card regularly and replace it whenever necessary.


#### · Cable Rubber

Foreign matter may get inside if reconnecting is failed after removing the cable access hole rubber.



- Check your local laws and regulations on making video or audio recordings. The user will be held liable for any violation of the law.
- When switching over from 12 VDC to PoE as the power source, the system will be rebooted once the power adapter is disconnected.
- Organize the power cable so that it will not cause people to trip over or become damaged from chairs, cabinets, desks, and other objects in the vicinity. Do not run the power cable underneath carpet or a rug or plug the cable into a power outlet shared by a number of other devices.

### Factory Reset

Only use the factory reset button to restore the camera to its factory default settings.




A factory reset will clear all camera settings configured by the user.

- 1 Shut off the power supply.
- 2 Remove the dome cover and then press the reset button down.
- 3 Hold the button down and reconnect the power adapter.
- 4 Once the device turns back on, wait 5 seconds, and then release the reset button.
- 5 The device will go through the resetting process and reboot. All camera settings will be restored to their factory defaults after the reboot.

It's also possible to do a factory reset by pressing and releasing the reset button while the camera is turned on or using the IDIS Discovery program from a remote location. A factory reset will reboot the system. For more information on factory reset, refer to the **IDIS Discovery operation manual**.





# Remove the Dome Cover and Body


1 Loosen the screws counterclockwise using the allen wrench provided with the product.



2 Remove the dome cover.




3 Pull the lever and rotate the camera body counterclockwise to separate it from the installation bracket.



# Inserting a SD Memory Card

Insert a SD memory card into the SD memory card slot with the 'micro SD' print facing upward.





Push the SD memory card until it disengages from the slot, and then pull it out.


# Installation



- Check the wall or ceiling to see if it needs to be reinforced. The camera may fall off if the wall or ceiling is not strong enough to support its weight.
- Install the camera in a shaded area. If the camera is installed in direct sunlight, it may be affected adversely.
- 1 Use the screws, anchor provided with the camera to secure the installation bracket on a wall or a ceiling.





Refer to the installation bracket and drill holes that align with the screw and cable positions.





(If necessary) Attach one end of the safety wire (not provided) to the wall or ceiling, and the other end of the safety wire to the installation location on the installation bracket.






#### When connecting the cable to the side

Use the tool to remove it as shown below.




#### When installing by connecting the pipe


Press the pipe cover left and right to separate it, then connect the pipe to the installation bracket as shown in the figure.



- 2 Make the network cable go through the cable rubber using the protect connector.
  - 2-1 Remove the protrusion part from the cable rubber along the dotted line.




2–2Insert the LAN cable through the cable rubber using the protect connector.





The use of lubricant is recommended to insert the LAN cable smoothly.

2-3Pull the cable slightly and arrange the rubber as shown below.







If you insert a thin cable or more than two cables, it is advised to finish by using silicon to make sure to perfectly waterproof it. (Silicon finishing part — refer to the bottom image.)




- 3 Assemble the cable rubber to the camera body.
- 4 Connect the terminal blocks and RJ45 cable.




5 Attach the enclosed desiccant folding in haf in the bottom to prevent moisture.



6 Prevent dropping by hanging the safety wire on the designated hook on the installation bracket.




7 Attach the camera body to the installation bracket by rotating it clockwise as shown below. You will hear a click when it is properly mounted.



- 8 Connect external devices, the network cable, and the power adapter.
- Adjust the angle. For more information, refer to the Angle Adjustment.

# Angle Adjustment

The lens can be rotated along three axes.

#### · Lens Rotation

Used to adjust the lens' rotation angle. Turn the lens rotator clockwise or counterclockwise direction.

#### · Vertical Rotation

Used to adjust the lens' vertical angle.




When the vertical (tilt) angle is more than 65°, some parts of the screen may appear distorted or the image may appear blurry, depending on the zoom ratio.

#### · Horizontal Rotation

Used to adjust the lens' horizontal angle. Turn the horizontal rotator in the clockwise or counterclockwise direction.

# Closing the Dome Cover


Fasten the screws for the dome cover clockwise using the Allen wrench provided with the camera.







# With DirectIP® NVR-based Layout

For users using the camera with DirectIP® NVR connection, do not need to consider contents in the camera operation manual.

# With non DirectIP® NVR-based Layout



Control the camera over the network from software installed on a computer. Ideal for using the camera over the network from a remote location.

The contents in the camera operation manual are only for users using the camera with non DirectIP® NVR connection or VMS connection such as IDIS Center.

# Troubleshooting

Problem	Check
The main unit won't turn on.	<ul> <li>Check the power cable connection. If using a PoE switch to supply power to the camera using an Ethernet cable, check the Ethernet cable connection.</li> <li>Check the power outlet. If using a PoE switch to supply power to the camera using an Ethernet cable, check the PSE device's power supply.</li> </ul>
PoE switch isn't being recognized.	Check the grounding status of the I/O device connected to the camera and the PoE switch. If they are not grounded, ground them and try again.
I can't see Live videos.	<ul> <li>Check the camera's power status.</li> <li>Ensure that cables are properly connected to the camera and the lens.</li> <li>Check the network connection status of the computer and the network camera.</li> </ul>
Images are blurry.	<ul> <li>Make sure the lens is clean. If not, clean it using a soft piece of cloth or a brush.</li> <li>Make sure the lens is in focus. Adjust the focus during daytime.</li> <li>If there is too much light coming into the camera or the camera is picking up an overly bright light source, adjust the camera's position/angle accordingly.</li> </ul>
Video color appears incorrect.	Check the white balance settings. If using the <b>Auto</b> option, it may take some time for the white balance to be adjusted.
Images are blinking.	If the camera is pointed at the sun or a fluorescent lamp, adjust the camera's angle away.
Lost the admin ID and password and unable to connect to a network camera.	You must perform a factory reset. A factory reset will revert all settings, including network settings, to their factory defaults. After performing a factory reset, make a memo of the admin ID and password as a safety precaution.
Unable to launch IDIS Web.	If the IDIS Web login screen is not loading, check which version of Microsoft Internet Explorer you are using. IDIS Web may not launch properly on versions 10 or below.


